Lesson from Stick Transformation

On June 6, we, the Trillium Chapter from the Exeter area had a day of preparing sticks for upcoming shows and to help out the new chapter in Chatham Kent. We had a total of 15 people



come out. Various tasks were divided out: 4 people on the routers rounding the ends of the walking sticks, 4 people drilling holes, 1 on quality control and sanding, 2 people on bundling and tying, 2 on staining, 1 "gofer", and another moving sticks to keep everyone going. We started at about 10:30 am and worked till about 3:30 pm with 30 plus minutes for pizza and break. By the end of the day we had processed about 6,000 walking sticks. A job well done and a thank-you to all involved.

Now in reading the above you probably were surprised at the mention of staining our sticks. Let me explain.

A few years ago, when we got our shipment of sticks, unfortunately some pallets of sticks came that were old, badly discoloured, and just not usable. We informed the shipper of the problem and were told to take them off the bill of sale. They were designated for the burn pile but someone suggested we stain them and thus perhaps we could use them.

Well, there are a lot of parallels between us and those sticks. All of us are black with sin. Totally unusable. Designated for Hell. But! For the blood of His Son. If we allow ourselves to be washed in the blood of His Son then God can use us. Just like the story of Saul in the Bible. Saul changed when he met Jesus. A persecutor of the church became a preacher and teacher for Jesus. Maybe you have thought about using a gift for God and have heard Satan whisper "really?" Don't be discouraged. We are all unlikely instruments of God's Grace. Just like those ugly unusable sticks, once stained, now they are coveted by all. Your life too can be transformed by the Creator of the Universe.

His humble attitude and quick smile encouraged many. The title of this poem "How's Your Ride?" is my question to each of you. Pastor Randy had an excuse to slack off, although he never did. But, how about you and me? Kathy and I have been reading Ezekiel 33 with special interest in the first nine verses in our morning devotion time. It talks about the responsibility of being a Watchman. The times we live in are perilous at best and we need to do all we can to blow the horn, warning others of the coming danger. Each day people enter into eternity and I'm sure many are not prepared. The busy summer schedule is upon us and let's do all we can to serve as a Watchman. The Fellowship of Christian Farmers has given us the needed tools, now it's up to us to use them.

Recruiting Punjabi Speaking Volunteers for Canada Day

Our faithful volunteers, Ed & Norma Plett, FCFC's National Board Vice President and his wife, have offered to spearhead the upcoming Canada Day event on July 1st, at Rotary Stadium in Abbotsford. This local event done each year by our Fraser Valley Chapter will take place right here, while as BC's Fieldman, I plan, with my wife Carol, to host a booth and enter the Parade in the 4-day week-end Williams Lake Stampede event, about 500 kms to the North.

Abbotsford is currently experiencing a heavy influx of Indo-Canadian folks coming from East India, so we always have about 60% of our guests attending on Canada Day from that segment of the population. However, to date we have not been able to communicate with them, other than to share our 5-coloured bead tract which we had translated into Punjabi a few years ago for that very purpose.

On May 26th, Carol & I attended the 5:00 P.M. "Punjabi Connection" Sunday evening service at South Abbotsford Mennonite Brethren Church. Our host "Lakhvir", was very gracious to translate our short FCFC history lesson and the 3-minute story of the 5-coloured beads for us. We also made a plea for Punjabi speaking volunteers to help us in the local Canada Day event. Their Punjabi Pastor then preached a powerful and extremely enthusiastic message of going out into your world and sharing the Gospel with everyone right where you live! While we could not understand much of what he was saying, we were able to follow along through the various half dozen or more scripture passages which he



always announced in English before they were read in Punjabi. The gist of the message was very clear and so very appropriate for our presentation, that when God is glorified through you, then the Holy Spirit is able to fill you. When that happens, not you, nor the devil, nor anyone else, will be able to restrain you from sharing the message of Jesus with others all around you!

Well it turned out his message found it's mark in the hearts of his congregation because as soon as the service was over we had 5 Punjabi speaking volunteers step up with their contact information, asking to attend out next Training Session. A few even offered to translate for us on July 1st, which will allow our regular volunteers to share in their own way with a translator to reach the Senior Indo-Canadian crowd coming for that coveted Gospel Walking Stick.

So once again, we have experienced the hand of God moving in this ministry to remind all of us just who this ministry really belongs to. We are just so very grateful to be called to spend our lives in serving our Master to fulfill His great commission in this very simple way.

Roy Nielsen, Central Nova Chapter, NS:

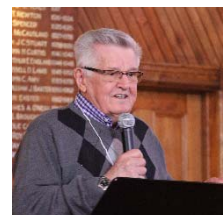

**Henry Janzen, Fraser Valley Chapter, BC:**

"Carol (*his wife*) and I work as a team. It is the greatest joy and privilege to serve the Lord. The FCF ministry provides a wonderful opportunity – I don't have to go to people; they come to me! They line up and wait 45 minutes to hear the message and receive a stick.

We sing 'I surrender all', but do we really do what we sing? Consider Colossians 3:1, are we really striving for things above, or are we striving for 'stuff' we can't take with us? Christians have that abundant life!

Quebec Fieldstaff Report

We want to honour and thank Sylvain Couture for his contributions as coordinator for Quebec over the last eleven years. He has, with the Lord's help, grown this ministry with Émilie from one district in Estrie to eleven districts and with others in development. Please keep them and us in prayer.

The ministry in Quebec has in place eleven chapters with 65 board members. Over 400 volunteers, over 115 churches participating in over 50 events.

The first priority that we have is to reassure the board members of the chapters that the FCFC ministry is God's work and that we would continue His work with His guidance and grace. As a result, in these last weeks a lot of our time has been spent meeting in person the board members in a number of board meetings and fundraising events. We have also participated in training sessions for volunteers, outreach events, and a church conference.

Over the last two years, Jessynia Théagène has been helping Sylvain and Émilie as an apprentice-coordinator - kiosk assistant, calling volunteers, organizing the schedules, doing church presentations, organizing fundraising events, helping them in volunteer trainings, and communications with churches, the chapters, and the edition of Le Semeur (the French newsletter).

Communication to Chapters

We launched the Inter-chapter AFCC Quebec Newsletter, so that all chapters would know our schedule of activities, have news of what is happening in other districts, and our needs which include seven administrative roles. So far, four volunteers have responded to fill these positions.

Regional development

Sylvain had started to develop four regions in Quebec that do not have any chapters yet: Centre du Québec, Lac-St-Jean, Rive-Nord and Baie-des-Chaleurs.

1) Centre du Québec (with these events: Victoriaville Agricultural Fair, Bécancourt Agricultural Fair). We decided to pursue the development work of Sylvain in this area. We still need to keep contact with the nearby churches to recruit volunteers. As of now, we have two volunteers who are interested in starting a new chapter, but they need more people. So we are praying for more volunteers. One church promised to help financially.

2) Lac-St-Jean (so far Sylvain organized three training sessions in the year of 2018-2019 in that region and two events (Festival Cowboy de Chambord and Salon de la Spiritualité de Roberval). Three regional churches got involved.

3) Rive-Nord of Montreal. We started this year, our first contact with Rive-Nord. We have an event at St-Jérôme (family fest). Pastor Réjean Demers has agreed to participate in that event.

4) *Baie-des-Chaleurs*: We stopped our involvement this year in Baie des Chaleurs, for lack of resources.

Redesign the website www.afcc.info

One of our main weaknesses here in Quebec is the follow-up of visitors who come to our booth. People are not willing to provide their personal information. But they want to know more about the message of the gospel. So we have been wondering how we could provide them with more information without taking their phone number. As we shared in our report at the AGM, 50% to 70% of our visitors in Quebec are less than 30 years old. In our tract, we provide the website of www.afcc.info but the website is not designed to provide visitors with more information on the gospel. Also, the design of our website in French is not professional and not current. We asked Vanessa Negreiros for advice. She is the secretary of the Mauricie Chapter, and the person who designed all our posters for the fundraising events. Her husband is a web designer. He could design and build our website free of charge. We saw some of his work and it is professional and what we want. We plan to define what are the essential services that we want.

The workload is important. For Robert, this has involved rescheduling many activities other than FCFC, so he thanks God and prays for His wisdom and guidance to be able to accomplish the best he can in His work. Please pray for us and all the FCFC/AFCC leaders and volunteers. Glory to God!
